

Narrow-leaf Milkweed

Asclepias fascicularis



CA Native:	Yes
Plant Community:	Yellow Pine Forest, Red Fir Forest, Lodgepole Forest, Foothill Woodland, Chaparral Valley Grassland, many plant communities, wetland-riparian
Form:	Perennial
Size:	3-6' tall, 2-3' wide
Light:	Full sun to part shade
Water:	Drought tolerant; average water, needs good drainage
WUCOLS:	1-6 (L)
Soil:	Adaptable; sand or clay but requires good drainage
Flowers/Berries:	Bloom in summer, typically small, pink, star-like flowers in clusters
Deer resistance:	Yes
Fire resistance:	Yes
Wildlife value:	The primary food for Monarch butterfly larvae, also attracts adult Monarch butterflies
Uses/Comments:	May cause minor dermatitis in humans
